

Conducting of Searches Policy

Rationale:

The purpose of this policy is to provide information and guidance to ensure we follow clear and appropriate processes when conducting a search.

- 1. Formal searches will take place only when deemed necessary by a member of the senior leadership team, who will conduct the search in the presence of a member of the teaching staff, preferably a member of senior leadership.
- 2. Students will be advised of the reason for the search.
- 3. If a student is suspected of being in possession of an illegal drug the Police will be contacted, if possible, prior to the search.
- 4. If students refuse a search, their parents will be contacted.
- 5. Bag(s), electronic devices and written material will not be searched without the student(s) who own them being present, except in exceptional circumstances.
- 6. Students themselves will empty bags/pockets under senior leadership team supervision.
- 7. Students have the right to ask for teachers of their own gender to conduct the search.
- 8. Students leaving for a School Camp or Outdoor Education activity may have their belongings (including the contents of their bags) inspected, but parents and students will be informed by prior notice.
- 9. Except in the case of number 8, parents or caregivers will be advised after the search.
- 10. Students and parents will be informed of this policy annually.
