Curriculum

Years 9 and 10

ESOL

Lincoln High School has an excellent English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Department.

International students are taught ESOL in small groups for a minimum of 5 hours per week. For the remaining subjects, students join mainstream classes.

Class Placement

In Years 9 and 10 students are placed into three streams based on their numeracy and literacy abilities.

Class placement in Years 11 to 13 is largely based on each student's choice of subjects. There is a minimum entry requirement for many of these subjects.
