Principal's Report



Tēnā koutou

We have been working on Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) for two years and are beginning the "roll out" to students. It has involved developing a behaviour curriculum which we all live by. After extensive surveys and discussions with staff, parents and students, four behaviour expectations have been developed: respectful, reliable, supportive, and resilient. Our desire is to ensure these behaviours are present in each and every member of our school community both in and out of the classroom.

We have held four special level assemblies this term where Tracy Drost and Marc Moore, parents of the victims of the 2016 Boxing Day crash spoke to the students. The driver of the car also came to the junior assemblies. It was a very

emotional, moving and direct presentation of what it felt like to suffer the loss of a child/friend when the kids had made a silly decision resulting in the death of three young people. The effect was profound with students realising the impact of such a decision. Comments like "I will never drive with passengers" "I won't sneak out at night".... were heard as the students left the hall. The parents talked about "anonymous narking" as a way to help friends and ensuring kids that it is ok to alert adults if they know something that may impact on the safety of others. We are sincerely grateful to Tracy, Marc and the driver for giving up their time to share their feelings and experiences with us.

While the senior students have been sitting NCEA exams, the juniors have been busy with a wide range of activities. There have been a number of successful House events at lunchtime which our enthusiastic Junior Council have organised. It was a pleasure to see the Adopt a Scientist presentations, with our students inviting their scientists in to the presentation evening — it was a very professional and polished evening with outstanding commitment and enthusiasm from all the students. We thank our Science teacher, Dr Rose Travis for her commitment to ensuring the programme was very successful. It was a very proud evening for all concerned. Our Year 10 Drama students produced wonderful performances for parents and teachers under the watchful eye of their very talented and dedicated teacher, Mrs Sandra McLean. It was a pleasure to watch the students in action.

The challenge to our students is to ensure they get involved in the wider life of the school – there is plenty on offer! The Secondary School Sports Census has reported a 5% increase in participation in sport at Lincoln High School this year which is extremely pleasing and credit goes to all those involved in making sport possible in the school.

NCEA information:

NCEA Assessments and Holiday Absences

Early next year all Year 11, 12 and 13 students will receive an NCEA Assessment Procedures Handbook. This booklet refers to entitlements for catch-up opportunities for NCEA assessments. In preparation for next year, it is important that students and families realise that if a student misses an NCEA assessment due to a family holiday (during the school year), they are **not** entitled to a catch-up opportunity.

NCEA and New Zealand Scholarship 2017 Results

The following information is from NZQA (<u>www.nzqa.govt.nz</u>).

- NCEA students need to remember that NCEA results (including exam results) will only be reported online (unless they have requested a result notice through the Learner login prior to 31st December).
- Students will be able to access their NCEA results in mid-January 2018.
- Students who have never logged in to the NZQA secure learner site should register now using their National Student Number (NSN) and date of birth.
- Reconsideration and Review forms will continue to be available from the Learner login area only and will be available after exam papers have been returned to students in January. Applications for a review or a reconsideration of the 2017 external examination results close on 16th February 2018.

Further details are available here.

 Ordering your results documents is done online. The Record of Achievement will not be updated with 2017 results until mid-January 2018. It will then be available in electronic format through the Learner login. Students are entitled to one hard copy free of charge, with further copies costing \$15.30 each.

• Year 11-13 Students who have a permanent change of address from December onwards need to inform school and also NZQA on 0800 697 296 before 31st December in order to update their details, to ensure their exam booklets get sent to the correct address. NZQA send out the exam booklets in January 2018.

Canterbury A&P Show

LHS was well-represented again at the recent Canterbury A&P Show, with a team of six students involved with the beef cattle section. They worked with the local Piwakawaka Limousin Stud (Gary Kennett—staff).

The Show promotes youth involvement through handler, judging and school teams' competitions and is a regular and well supported part of the cattle programme.

The students were required to prepare the animals before the Show (e.g. leading, preparation, grooming), be responsible for the animals during the three days (e.g. mucking out pens, feeding and watering, washing, grooming), and parade the ani-



mals in various competitions. There were some very early starts for the students!

In the Handler Competition, Emma Owen (Year 13) came second in her class. Emma led a yearling heifer and paraded it very competently.


Other highlights were their involvement in the Cattle and Grand Parades where hundreds of animals are paraded around the main arena.

Confucius Institute Prizegiving

There are eight Confucius Classrooms in the South Island and Lincoln High School was awarded the Confucius Classroom of the Year award on Tuesday evening 21st November 2017, at the Confucius Institute Prizegiving held at St Margaret's. This is for the work in the Selwyn Community with the Year 7-8 Chinese Programme, which has 550 students taking weekly Mandarin through the programme, and also for the high achievement of Taylin Smith competing in the World Chinese Language Competition this year.

This is the second time Lincoln High School has had the honour of winning this award.

Taylin performed her Chinese dance at the Prizegiving.

Lincoln High School was also awarded the best school for Calligraphy in the 8th New Zealand Chinese Calligraphy Competition 2017.

In the South Island there are 127 schools which offer Mandarin, and now there are 14,000 students in the South Island learning it.

Year 9 Enrichment Students

Edward Lopas, Jack Dowle, Jacinda Riley and Ellie Walker are working with expert Chris Woods from the National Institute of Water and Atmospheric Research (NIWA Taihoro Nukurangi), which was established in 1992 as a Crown Research Institute. Students are surveying sites at Cass Bay using sieves and 50 x 50 quadrants to determine any differences in organisms which reside along this particular coast line. The photos show students laying out the quadrant and identifying species present. Their results will be presented at the end of Term Four.

Scientist – Dr Chris Woods Marine Ecologist at NIWA offices

Title – Rocky Vs Sandy, The Age Old Question

We are studying the differences in sea life in sandy shores and rocky shores. We take a tally of everything that we find in 50cm X 50cm quadrants and finding the differences between the two shores. This is to find which are the better conditions for living in the two shores.

These photos are us taking tallies of the things we find in the sandy beach. We take tallies of a quarter of the quadrant, so the things we find will have to be times by eight.

Jack says – "So far I have enjoyed going out to the beach and doing something instead of doing an experiment inside and getting no Vitamin D".

Edward says – "Same here. I have enjoyed the project so far and am liking the responsibilities that this task takes and enjoy going to new places like Cass bay and getting those Instagram-worthy photos". We are mixing real data collection with science and technology to spread the news of what we are doing and why.

Title of our project: Rocky shore vs Sandy shore comparison

We have been comparing the marine life in rocky shores and sandy shores at Corsair Bay and Cass Bay. We use a 25 x 25 square quadrant for the area where we take the data from. We roughly divide the quadrant by four and we dig $\frac{1}{4}$. Whatever we find we record down and times by eight. We use this method on the sandy shore. We dig three quadrants in low tide, mid tide and high tide. On the rocky shore, we use the same quadrant. However, we do not divide into four. We record what we see straight away/exposed. We then turn over rocks and record the hidden marine life. The photos show us completing our research and collecting data for analysis.



We have enjoyed so many things so far in this investigation. We have both enjoyed going out to the beaches, discovering interesting marine life and Ellie enjoyed holding a non-nipping crab, whereas I screamed, as it was hard, but also slimy!
