

Lincoln High School Sports Contract



Being a member of a Lincoln High School sports team carries with it a number of responsibilities.

I agree to:

- abide by the principles of the fair play charter
- attend all meetings or give reasonable notice for non-attendance
- attend all practices and games on time or give reasonable notice for non-attendance
- wear the correct sports uniform and equipment for games (see policy below)
- pay by the due date the sports/bus fees (please note if a student should withdraw from a team the **FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE**).
- maintain a commitment to the team for the **FULL DURATION** of the season
- abide by the school regulations relating to travelling by private transport
- return all sports uniforms (washed) promptly after the season concludes

School policy states that students will be invoiced for the repair or replacement of any equipment or uniforms that are lost or damaged through misuse. Uniforms are to be returned within one week of the final game or you will be invoiced for the replacement cost.

Students travelling to/from town sport can wear the following:

- School tracksuit
- Black tracksuit pants or school tracksuit pants
- Green PE shirt **or** playing top
- School jersey
- Lincoln High School sleeveless vest or fleece.

Failure to wear the correct sports uniform will result in the student being unable to travel to town sport.

SCHOOL SPORT CANTERBURY (SSC) CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

This code does not set out to provide a detailed prescription, but rather the broad principles of acceptable behaviour in secondary school sport in Canterbury.

Breaches of this or any other code could lead to disciplinary action by: the offender's school, SSC under its complaint procedure, or Regional Sports Organisations.

PLAYER CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

1. Play for enjoyment
2. Play hard but fair
3. Play to the laws of the game.
4. Be committed to your team. Attend all practices and matches.
5. Never argue with officials. Control your temper at all times.
6. Work equally hard for yourself and your team.
7. Be a good sport. Applaud all good play whether by your team or your opponent.
8. Remember the goals of the game are to have fun, improve your skills and feel good.
9. Use appropriate and acceptable language.
10. Thank the opposition and officials at the end of the game.
11. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

COACH CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

1. Positively reinforce the actions of players.
2. Lead by example.
3. Be honest with yourself and players.
4. Create an enjoyable environment in which to play the game.
5. Develop team respect for officials
6. Give all players the opportunity to participate in the game.
7. Insist on fairplay and discipline.
8. Be reasonable on the demand on players' time, energy and enthusiasm.
9. Encourage sportsmanship.
10. Use appropriate and acceptable language.

SPECTATOR/PARENT CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

1. Applaud the performance of both teams.
2. Be positive with the officials.
3. Acknowledge the efforts of the officials.
4. Let the players play their game, not your game.
5. Praise efforts, not results.
6. Set an example for the players.
7. Use appropriate and acceptable language.

SUPPORTERS CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

1. Encourage all participants to play within the rules of the game.
2. Display self-control on the sideline.
3. Show appreciation to coaches and officials who facilitate the game.
4. Remember young people play sport for their satisfaction not yours.

OFFICIALS CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

1. Control the game in a fair and positive manner.
2. Be consistent and objective in your rulings.
3. Modify your approach to suit the level of player skill.
4. Help players learn the rules by explaining decisions where appropriate.
5. Do what you can to make sure that everyone enjoys the game.
6. Encourage fair play and not tolerate foul play of any kind.
7. Be a positive role model.
